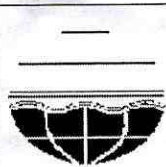

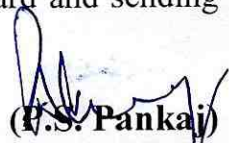

At the outset, Chairman, DPCC, welcomed the members and thanked them for attending the meeting. As this was the first meeting chaired by the present Chairman, DPCC, the meeting started with the introduction of the members present in the meeting. Member Secretary, DPCC enquired if any member had any objection/ remark with respect to the minutes of the 67th DPCC Board meeting held on 25.10.2018. No member raised any objection and therefore, minutes of 67th DPCC Board meeting stands confirmed.

Agenda 3: Steps Taken By DPCC For Implementation Of The Decision Of Advisory Committee Regarding Development Of Additional Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facility(ies) {CBWTF(s)} in Delhi

Mrs. Ajeeta D. Agrawal, SEE briefed the committee about the status of bio-medical generation and its disposal. The legal provisions w.r.t setting up of CBWTF were also discussed. Dr. T.K. Joshi opined that the cost factor on the issue of health should not be considered. Keeping in view the peculiar situation of Delhi w.r.t Air and Water Pollution the committee is of the view that a CBWTF with all necessary ingredients should be planned for Delhi.

Decision :

The matter may be placed before the committee after seeking the comments of Health Department, Law Department, Finance Department for further decision in this regard.

Agenda 4: Procedure For Utilization/Recycling/ Management Of Spent Fixer (Hypo) Solution Generated From X-Ray Films- Review Of The Decision Taken In Meeting Dated 25/10/18

The Committee was briefed on the issue by the Member Secretary, DPCC. It was informed that the disposal of Spent Fixer (Hypo) Solution Generated from X-Ray Films is a major issue in the absence of registered recycler in Delhi. The issue has been detailed in the agenda for the decision.

Decision:

The Committee directed the following:

- i) A public notice may be issued stating that any recycler/ operator of a facility who has authorization from the concerned Pollution Control Boards of neighboring states for the utilization/ reuse and final disposal of this waste with permission to lift the waste from other states may apply for authorization in Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC)
- ii) A letter may be sent to DHS and DMA for wide circulation among their registered hospitals/ members for applying for authorization in Delhi Pollution Control Committee under Hazardous and other Waste (Management and Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2016 for generation, storage and handling of hazardous waste.
- iii) Till the time the process is streamlined and set as per law, HCFs may be directed to store the hazardous waste in their premises.

In addition to above as per the suggestion of Ms. Bharati Chaturvedi of M/s Chintan Environment Research and Action Group, a committee decided that an inventorization of spent fixer be done immediately.

Agenda 5: Impact of air pollution public health/ an observational study- a research project regarding

The committee took a note of objective of the study which is as below:

1. To determine the relationship of outdoor air quality with the rate of admissions for cardiac (Stroke, CAD) and respiratory (Bronchitis, Bronchial Asthma) conditions.
2. To find the impact of air pollution in restricting the routine activities among healthy adults (≥ 18 years) in the community.

Decision:

The committee ratified the decision of Chairman, DPCC.

Agenda 6: Installation of on-line Continuous Monitoring Systems at various locations of River Yamuna, Major drains outfall, and Drains of industrial areas

Dr. Nandita Moitra, Incharge (Water Lab) brought to the notice of the committee that CPCB vide letter dated 06.02.2017 has desired for the expansion of Monitoring network under National Water Quality Programme. It was also brought to the notice of the committee that action plan submitted to Hon'ble NGT by monitoring committee has mentioned that there is need to set up more on-line continuous monitoring stations. The estimated cost for the installation of 53 monitoring stations is about 26.5 Crores. Member Secretary, DPCC informed that expenditure shall be met from the Environmental Damages received in DPCC. Chairman DPCC suggested to appoint the bid manager on the issue. Dr. Nandita Moitra informed that since matter is to be taken up on urgent basis, going for associating bid manager may entail delay.

Decision:

The committee approved the proposal for setting up the On-Line Monitoring Systems at various locations (53 nos) of Yamuna River, Major Drains and industrial areas drains subject to fulfillment of all codal formalities as enumerated in General Financial Rules (GFR).

(Action by Water Lab)

Agenda 7: Installation of on-line Continuous Monitoring Systems at Wazirabad Water Works & Okhla Barrage

It was brought to the notice of the committee that CPCB has handed over both the online monitoring systems to DPCC in the month of Feb, 2019 and systems are operational at both the locations.

The total operational and Maintenance cost for two years is Rs 44,38,112 /- (forty four lakhs thirty eight thousand one hundred twelve Rs only) .

One system for on-line continuous Ammonia monitoring is being installed at Palla. The cost of the system is Rs 12,27,000/- (twelve lakhs twenty seven thousand Rs only). This will be made operational by 31.03.2019 as per direction given by MC.

Decision:

The committee approved the proposal.

AGENDA 8: Facilitating Oversight Committee headed by Justice (Retd) Pratibha Rani at Vikas Bhawan-II, Civil Lines

Member Secretary, DPCC informed that as per the order of Hon'ble NGT order dated 24.1.2019 in OA No. 601/2018 (C/15) which has directed for constitution of Oversight Committee headed by Justice Pratibha Rani (Retd) consisting of representatives of Municipal authorities, Revenue authorities of 11 districts, DSIIDC, DDA, CPCB. DPCC is the nodal agency. Sitting space and other infrastructure needs to be provided by the CS and the Chairman DPCC.

Decision:

The committee approved the proposed infrastructure and secretarial staff.

(Action by CMC- IV)

AGENDA 9: Redressal of public complaints against industrial/commercial units operating in residential/non-conforming/conforming areas in Delhi

Member Secretary informed that the complaints in the non-conforming area is to be dealt by the concerned local bodies as per the decision taken in the meetings held on 08.12.2010, 14.07.2011, 09.12.2011 and 05.06.2015 under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary. It is proposed that henceforth the complaints pertaining to local bodies which were being forwarded should be issued with the directions under Air Act and Water Act.

Decision:

The committee approved the proposal with the suggestion that if no compliance report is received within 15 days a penalty may be levied on the concerned local bodies/ organizations.

(Action by CMC-V)

Agenda 10: Revision of monetary ceiling of facility of Newspaper/ Magazines to the Officers /Officials of DPCC

Member Secretary informed that proposal is for enhancement of ceiling of facility of Newspaper/ Magazines to the Officers /Officials of DPCC. The payment is being made as per the order dated 19.06.2001 after which two pay commissions have been introduced. The office order dated 19.06.2001, 19.10.2011 and Office Memorandum dated 25.09.2003 and 03.04.2018 were also placed before the committee for the enhancement of Monetary Limits.

Decision:

The Committee approved the proposal.

(Action by Administrative Cell)



AGENDA 11: Reference AGENDA No. 09 of DPCC Board Meeting dated 27/02/2017 and Agenda 02 of DPCC Board Meeting dated 25/10/2018 regarding representations of three LDCs (now UDC) for consideration of Adhoc promotion from retrospective effect

The representation of the 3 LDCs was discussed.

Decision:

In view of peculiar circumstances and for the sake of parity, the Committee approved the Agenda as proposed. The Committee decided that in the next Board meeting as per the decision taken in 67th Board Meeting, grievances of other employees for promotions, etc should also be redressed expeditiously.

Agenda 12: Engagement of Consultants in DPCC

Member Secretary informed that for effective working of DPCC in view of orders of Hon'ble Court, it is proposed to appoint Four expert in the following fields e.g.

1. Water Pollution
2. Air Pollution
3. Solid Waste Management
4. Media Advisor for Mass Awareness

The GOI guidelines issued vide DoPT O.M. No. 16012/7/97-Estt.(Allowance) dated 13.02.1998 with regard to engagement of Consultants are annexed as **Annexure- I**.

Further, as per guidelines of engagement of Consultants, the strength of Consultants should be restricted to 10% of posts of total number of posts at the level of Joint Secretary and above. However, it is submitted that as the higher level of posts are very less in number and expertise are required in different fields, DPCC may relax number of post to be engaged as Consultants.

Decision:

The Committee approved the proposal of engaging consultants as proposed.

(Action by Administrative Cell)

AGENDA-13: Reduction of One Time Fee From Rs. 5000/- To Rs. 2500/- In Case Of Non-Bedded / Stand Alone Clinics.

The Member Secretary informed that as per the decision taken in the Advisory Committee, the registration fee is to be reduced from Rs. 5,000/- to Rs. 2,500/-. Members of the Committee did not agree with the proposal as this is a fee for one time registration.



Decision:

It was decided that an Agenda may be prepared on the above for placing it on the Advisory Committee.

Agenda 14: Revival of Corporate Membership of Delhi Gymkhana Club for Chairman, DPCC.

Member Secretary informed that DPCC had corporate membership of Delhi Gymkhana Club from July, 2008 to June, 2018 and that DPCC is an important regulatory body and dealing with various stakeholders working in the field of Environment. DPCC has several committees, which operates in discharge of its official duties. These committees have to meet over lunch and dinner for official purpose, which is possible at very decent and reasonable rates at the club in comparison to commercial Hotels/Restaurants rates. In addition, membership of Delhi Gymkhana Club allows use of all club facilities for visiting experts and foreign delegations on the subject of pollution control and waste management. Seminars and conferences on vital issues of environment conservation and protection can also be arranged at the club at very reasonable rates. The library can be used for keeping upto date with the vast collection of literatures available. Environmental experts / foreign delegate can also be lodged at the club if they are guests of DPCC as an organization. Delhi Gymkhana Club provides very useful platform for interaction with various stakeholders.

Decision:

The Committee approved the proposal for revival of Corporate Membership of Delhi Gymkhana Club for one Nominee in the name of Chairman, DPCC.

Table Agenda No. 1

Member Secretary brought to the notice of the Committee that White Category industries are required to register online on DPCC Website. Since, there are no fees for the registration, the units which are not entitled for the registration in non-conforming area are taking advantage of this facility. To discourage fake units, it is advised to charge these units on one time basis i.e. Rs. 10,000/-.

Decision:

The Committee approved the proposal.

Requirement of seeking Completion Certificate while processing Consents.

The consent are granted under the provisions of Water(Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act 1974 and Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution Act) 1981. While issuing consent generally a condition is imposed that "Consent granted to consentee is to ensure control of pollution from the premises of the unit in accordance with various pollution control laws and in no way confers the right to consentee/unit to exist in violation of other laws and statutory provision including Master Plan of Delhi". However, in



the premises of the consentee the safety of occupants are of utmost important and safety norms are governed by the Building By Laws being implemented by local authorities. For fire safety the buildings are required to seek no objection certificate from fire department. Accordingly, completion certificates are issued by the local bodies after completion of the construction of building as per sanctioned building plans.

In view of above it is proposed that DPCC may also seek the copy of Completion Certificate before issuing consent to operate or adopt some method so that consents are issued to the buildings/premises which are compliant with safety norms .

The matter was deliberated in the meeting and it was decided that members may come forward with their views on the issue in next meeting.

Decision:

The Committee approved the proposal.
