Please find enclosed herewith the minutes of meeting of Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Delhi with the CETP Societies/ Operator of Common Effluent Treatment Plants (CETPs) in Delhi to discuss the issues related to CETPs in Delhi **held on 19.05.2023 at 4:00 PM through Physical mode in the Conference Room at Raj Niwas for urgent necessary action as mentioned in the said minutes.**

Minutes of the Meeting of Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Delhi with the CETP Societies on the issues related to CETPs in Delhi in the context of Hon'ble NGT's directions regarding rejuvenation of Yamuna, held in the Conference Room at Raj Niwas, Delhi on 19.05.2023 at 04: 00 PM.

Attendance Sheet of the participants is at Annexure – "A".

Spl. Secy (Env) cum Member Secretary, DPCC made a presentation on CETPs (Common Effluent Treatment Plants) in Delhi and related issues. It was informed that there are 13 CETPs in Delhi for the treatment of effluent generated from 17 Approved Industrial Areas / Estates in Delhi. 11 CETPs have been constructed by DSIIDC on the design of NEERI as per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in WP(C) No. 4677/ 1985 in the matter of M.C. Mehta Vs. Union of India & Ors. and rest two CETPs at Narela&Bawana have been constructed by DSIIDC on its own. The Industries/ Units which are operational in non-CETP Industrial Areas / Estates have individual waste water treatment facilities (ETPs).

11 CETPs were constructed with the contribution from Central Govt. (25 %), State Govt. (25 %) and Industries / units in Industrial Areas / Estates connected to CETPs (50 %) as per the Scheme of MoEF and orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court in WP(C) No. 4677/ 1985.

10 CETPs are based on Physico-chemical treatment process, one CETP at Mangolpuri is based on Biological treatment process and rest 2 CETPs at Narela&Bawana are based on Physico – chemical treatment and Biological treatment process. Total design capacity of all the 13 CETPs in Delhi is 212.3 MLD against which CETPs are receiving only 68.15 MLD (Capacity utilisation 32.1 %). CETPs have been designed to treat mix waste i.e. industrial effluent and sewage (from Toilets / Bath Rooms) generated from the Industries / Units in the Industrial Areas / Estates connected with CETPs. There is common conveyance system for carrying the effluent from the Industrial Areas / Estates to concerned CETPs.

Govt. of NCT of Delhi enacted "The Delhi Common Effluent Treatment Plants Act, 2000" vide Notification dated 05.01.2001 and "The Delhi Common Effluent Treatment Plants Rules, 2001" vide Notification dated 22.05.2001 to provide for recovery of the dues as arrears of land revenue in respect of the capital and recurring costs of CETPs set up in the Industrial Estate in the NCT of Delhi and matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Commissioner of Industries or any other officer not below the rank of Joint Director authorised by him from time to time in this regard is the "Appropriate Authority" under the said CETP Act, 2000 for carrying out the apportionment of the cost among the occupiers of the CETP in respect of Initial Capital Cost, Recurring Cost, Operation & Maintenance Cost, recovery of any dues from the occupiers and to take such other steps as may be necessary for the fulfilment of the objects of the CETP Act, 2000.

As directed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court vide order dated 26.04.2005 in WP (C) No. 4677 / 1985 in the matter of M.C. Mehta Vs. Union of India & Others and after the several meetings of the EPCA Operation & Maintenance of the CETPs were handed over to the CETP Societies in 2005 to 2007 except Naraina CETP which was handed over to concerned CETP Society in 01.06.2011 and Lawrence Road CETP which was handed over to concerned CETP Society in December, 2017. Separate Agreements between Industries Department, GNCTD, DSIIDC & DJB and 11 CETP Societies were signed on 20.07.2005 for maintenance and operation of CETPs in Delhi.

After deliberations and discussions on the various issues raised by the CETP Societies/ Operators of CETPs at Narela&Bawana, following decisions were taken :

1. Under Utilized Capacities of CETPs

It was informed that total design capacity of all the 13 CETPs in Delhi is 212.3 MLD against which CETPs are receiving only 68.15 MLD (32.1 % of Capacity). All the CETPs except Mangolpuri CETP are underutilized.

Chairman of Jhilmil & Friends Colony Industrial Area CETP Society raised doubt on the installed capacity of Jhilmil CETP i.e 16.8 MLD designed by NEERI. General Secretary of Mangolpuri CETP informed that Mangolpuri CETP is receiving sufficient quantum of waste water and keeping the future requirement, enhancement of capacity and upgradation of Mangolpuri CETP is required. Representatives of other CETP Societies also informed regarding requirement of upgradation of their CETPs.

MD, DSIIDC informed that all the 13 CETPs are to be upgraded including Mangolpuri CETP. NEERI has already carried out studies in this regard and submitted Draft Integrated Report titled "Status, Gap Analysis and Suggestions for Improvement and Upgradation in existing 13 CETPs of Delhi" to DSIIDC.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed representative of NEERI to check / reassess the installed capacity of all the CETPs within 30 days and Industries Department /DSIIDC to expedite the matter regarding upgradation of CETPs in Delhi.

(Action: NEERI / Industries Department /DSIIDC)

2. Membership of CETP Society

It was informed that as per the Orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court in WP(C) No. 4677/ 1985 in the matter of M.C. Mehta Vs. Union of India &Ors. and CETP Act, 2000, All the Industries/ Units including Commercial Establishments located in Industrial Areas / Estates connected to CETPs are required to take membership of concerned CETP Society. However there are number of Industries/ Units/ Commercial Establishments which have not taken the membership of CETP Societies.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed joint inspection to be led by Industries so that Industries/ Units in the Industrial Areas / Estates connected to CETPs take membership of the CETP Societies. Industries Department to take action against the defaulters as per the provisions of the CETP Act, 2000 & CETP Rules, 2001 and also issue necessary order / directions regarding payment by the Commercial Complexes / Establishments / Shops / Offices etc. List of defaulters which are not the members of the CETP Societies shall be provided by the CETP Societies to Industries Department/ DPCC.

(Action: Industries Department/ CETP Societies)

3. Non –Deposition of Contributory Share by the Member Units

It was informed that non deposition of contributory share by the individual member units is affecting the operation & maintenance of CETPs due to lack of Funds. Member units are not paying their share regularly.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed Industries Department to constitute joint teams of Industries Department, DSIIDC & DPCC for taking necessary action against the defaulters in the Industrial Areas / Estates connected to CETPs. List of defaulters which are not paying their contributory share to the CETP Societies shall be provided by the CETP Societies to Industries Department. Appropriate Authority under the CETP Act shall take necessary action against the defaulters as per the provisions of the CETP Act, 2000 & CETP Rules, 2001 including closure / sealing of the Industries / Units and disconnection of their electricity & water supply. DPCC shall take action against the violating water polluting Industries / Units as per the provisions of the Water Act, 1974.

(Action: Industries Department/ DSIIDC/ DPCC/CETP Societies)

4. Cost Apportionment Formula

Latest formula for cost apportionment issued vide notification dated 2.11.2022 by Industries Department, GNCTD is based on category of industries (Red / Orange / Green / White) is not effective as the calculated amount by this formula (particularly share of white category) is very less and not sufficient to fulfill the cost of operation & maintenance of CETPs.

CETP Societies informed that old formula for cost apportionment be again enforced / implemented for better collection of the operation & maintenance cost from the member units. MD, DSIIDC informed that new formula for cost apportionment was notified after consulting NEERI for making the formula simpler one.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed Industries Department to resolve the issue with a separate meeting with CETP Societies.

(Action: Industries Department)

5. Transfer of Powers to CETP Societies for Action against Defaulters

CETP Societies informed that the power of action against defaulter units is with Appropriate Authority (Commissioner of Industries/ Joint Director) under the CETP Act, 2000. This power was earlier delegated to CETP Societies which was later on withdrawn. In absence of power to take action against defaulter units the collection of share from the member units is difficult.

As per the CETP Rules, 2001, CETP Societies are required to issue demand letter to the occupier of a factory premises in Form II for deposit of apportioned cost of CETP and provide list of defaulters to the Appropriate Authority in the table prescribed under Schedule-III of the said Rules.

Appropriate Authority under the CETP Act is required to issue Notice in Form III to the defaulters which have failed to deposit apportioned cost.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed CETP Societies to issue fresh Show Cause Notice to the Defaulters for payment of dues and Industries Department to take necessary action for resolving the issue.

(Action: CETP Societies/ Industries Department)

6. Waste water coming to CETPs from JJ Clusters/ Other Settlements in & around Industrial Areas

CETP Societies informed that there are JJ Clusters / Jhuggies / other settlements in and around the Industrial Areas connected with CETPs. President CETP Society of Okhla informed that domestic sewage of the nearby residential areas (Harikesh Nagar etc) /Jhuggisis coming through DJB sewer to the Okhla CETP causing heavy silt deposit in the CETP and adversely affecting the performance of CETP. CETPs are supposed to treat the effluent generated from Industries /units in the Industrial Areas connected with CETPs only and not supposed to treat the sewage from the nearby residential areas.

Treatment of waste water (sewage) generated from such clusters/ habitation is the responsibility of DJB and therefore either DJB should bear the cost of treatment of sewage or treat the waste water in their STPs.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed Industries Department and DJB to look into the matter and resolve the issue expeditiously.

(Action: Industries Department/ DJB)

7.Connection of Nearby Drains into CETP

Chairman of Jhilmil & Friends Colony Industrial Area CETP Societyinformed that earlier DJB laid the pipelines for connecting the nearby drains into the Jhilmil CETP against which the CETP Society filed Application before the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal. It was informed that the Joint Committee of CPCB and DPCC constituted by Hon'ble NGT has filed its report before the Tribunal and has not recommended for connecting the nearby drains into the JhilmilCETP without upgradation of the CETP.CETP Societies informed that connection of such drains carrying waste water/ sewage into their CETPs affects the performance of CETPs since there is no Bio-logical Treatment System in their CETPs (except MangolpuriCETP) and the cost involved for treatment also increases without any financial support from DJB.

Agreement signed by CETP Societies with Industries Department, DSIIDC & DJB on 20.07.2005 does not allow treatment of such wastewater from the drains outside of the Industrial Areas connected to CETP.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed Industries Department and DJB to look into the matter and resolve the issue expeditiously.

(Action: Industries Department/ DJB)

8.De-silting of Conveyance Systems / Sewer of DJB and Sump Well of CETPs

CETP Societies informed that regular de-silting of conveyance systems / sewer of DJB as well as Sump Well of DSIIDC is required by DJB &DSIIDC for proper operation and maintenance of CETPs.

CEO, DJB informed that DJB will take necessary action for De-silting of their sewerage/ conveyance system in the Industrial Areas connected with CETPs.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed DJB and DSIIDC to take urgent necessary action for de-silting of conveyance systems / sewer of DJB as well as Sump Well of CETPs after Joint Inspection with concerned CETP Societies.

(Action: DJB/ DSIIDC/CETP Societies)

9. Reuse of Treated Water.

As per the Agreement between Industries Department, DSIIDC, DJB & CETP Societies dated 20.07.2005, DSIIDC to finalize reuse plan for treated effluents from each CETPs in consultation with DJB & other Govt. Agencies (NDMC, MCD and the CETP Societies) and implement the same.

CETP Societies informed that treated water from CETPs is being utilized in the Parks, Horticulture etc. mainly from Narela CETP, Mayapuri CETP, Jhilmil CETP, Naraina CETP & Mangolpuri CETP. However most of the treated water from CETPs is being discharged into the drains/ sewer which can be utilized by the various Agencies including Govt. Departments particularly Park Owning Agencies in their Parks in the Industrial Areas connected with CETPs/ in other nearby areas & sprinkling on roads etc. and their cooperation is required for optimum use of treated water from CETPs.

CEO, DJB informed that treated water from CETPs should be of good quality having BOD/ TSS: 10/10 mg/l for its utilization in the Parks, Horticulture etc.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed DSIIDC to make a plan for maximising the use of treated water from CETPs in consultation with DJB, Govt. Agencies (DDA, MCD, PWD etc.) & CETP Societies. Govt. Agencies will provide list of their Parks & other possible users /usages alongwith details of requirement of treated water and present source of water for these purposes to DSIIDC.

(Action: DSIIDC/ DJB/ CETP Societies/ Govt. Agencies)

10. Upgradation of CETPS

Most of the CETPs are more than 15 years old and requires upgradation for reuse of treated effluent. CETPs are also receiving domestic sewage from the nearby residential areas / colonies/ jhuggies with significant organic load for which up gradation of CETPS with Biological treatment facilities is required. DPCC has already prescribed standards (BOD/TSS :10/10 mg/l) for up gradation of CETPs with the objective to use the treated effluent from the CETPs in Delhi.

DSIIDC engaged CSIR-NEERI in November, 2019 for providing consultancy w.r.t various issues related to CETPs including up gradation of CETPs in Delhi. NEERI has carried out Overall Performance Evaluation of all the 13 CETPs in Delhi and Draft Integrated Report titled "Status, Gap Analysis and Suggestions for Improvement and Upgradation in existing 13 CETPs of Delhi" has been submitted to DSIIDC.

Handing Over of CETPs for Up-gradation and Operation& Maintenance

As per the Order dated 27.01.2023 of Chief Secretary, GNCTD issued w.r.t NGT Order dated 09.01.2023 in OA No. 21 / 2023, Out of 13 CETPs, 02 CETPs at Narela and Bawana will be upgraded by DSIIDC by December, 2023 and w.r.t other 11 CETPs DSIIDC shall discuss the issue with DJB once again to decide finally who (DSIIDC / DJB) is the appropriate authority for upgradation and O&M of these CETPs, especially after considering the fact that sewage to be treated in STPs and CETPs is of different nature and composition.

A joint report is to be submitted by CEO, DJB and MD, DSIIDC recommending 'way forward' (including the appropriate authority (i.e. DJB or DSIIDC and timelines) for upgradation of CETPs to the Chief Secretary (Convener of the High Level Committee headed by Hon'ble Lt. Governor). The review proposal regarding transfer of 11 CETPs to Delhi Jal Board is under submission by DJB/ DSIIDC.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed Industries Department, DSIIDC & DJB to take urgent necessary action for Handing Over and Up-gradation of CETPs in Delhi.

(Action: Industries Department/ DSIIDC/ DJB)

11. Compliances to Prescribed Standards:

It was informed that out of 13 CETPs, 12 CETPs are meeting the prescribed standards and asked to take action against the CETP Society which is responsible for operation & maintenance of the Lawrence Road CETP which is continuously not meeting the prescribed standards in respect of BOD & TSS. The CETP Society is operating upto primary treatment only and there is lack of Aeration in the Equalisation Tank and Tertiary Treatment units (DMFs & ACFs) are not in use.

It was also informed about the heavy silt deposition in the units of BadliCETP for which the CETP Society was directed to take urgent action for removal of the silt for proper operation and maintenance of the Badli CETP.

The representative of KESPIA CETP Society operating & maintaining the Lawrence Road CETP, informed that they will take urgent necessary action to rectify the deficiencies for meeting the prescribed standards by June, 2023.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor directed Representative of KESPIA CETP Society to ensure that all the rectification measures are taken by the CETP Society so that Lawrence Road CETP meets the prescribed standards by June, 2023. BadliCETP Society to take urgent action for removal of silt from the units of CETP.

(Action: KESPIA CETP Society/ Badli CETP Society)

The OSD to Hon'ble Lt. Governor in his presentation mentioned following Important issues of Concern and recommendations :

Important issues of Concern

- Mixing of Sewage and Storm water with Industrial Effluent into Inlet of CETP.
- Monitoring of Individual Industrial Units for Pollution.
- Periodicity and Duration of Running of CETP.
- Issue of Over Design of CETP and Resultant Surplus capacity that is unlikely to be utilized.
- Utility of NEERI Recommended upgradation.
- Ability of CETP Societies to efficiently Run the Plants.

Recommendations:

- Regular Monitoring of Industrial Units as well as CETP's by DPCC.
- Delinking of Sewage and Storm Water from the CETP Inlets.
- A Feasibility Study of Combining the CETP's for optimum utilization of the Capacity.
- Only those to be converted to STP Where Full Capacity can be Used.
- Possibility of Downsizing the CETP for the Effluent Load be Explored.
- Empowerment of CETP Societies.
- Time Bound Recovery of Dues from the Defaulters by Industry Dept/DSIIDC.

It was further informed that most of the CETP Societies are not able to properly operate & maintain their CETPs and are ready to handover the CETPs to DSIIDC. CETP Societies should come forward with feasible solutions for under-utilized CETPs to prevent the wastage of resources i.e. electricity etc. Industries Department, DSIIDC and NEERI to consider above issues and recommendations while finalizing the upgradation of CETPs.

He also suggested re-assessment of the Pollution Load in Najafgarh Drain after taking measures by the various Govt. Departments (I&FCD, DJB, CETP Societies etc.) in the last 6 months.

CETP Societies requested to waive off the Environmental Compensation imposed by DPCC.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor emphasized that CETP Societies have to play a big role in cleaning of river Yamuna and should properly Operate & Maintain their CETPs to meet the prescribed standards and use the Treated water upto the maximum extent.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor also directed all the Departments and CETP Societies to work in close coordination to achieve the goal of cleaning river Yamuna in Delhi. Suggestions of CETP Societies if any including use of CETP Sludge for various purposes and on other issues including imposition of Environmental Compensation by DPCC on the CETP Societies may be sent to Office of Lt. Governor.

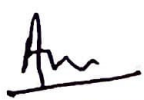
The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
